4th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C

Gospel Reflection Luke 4:21-30

That Gospel reading of Jesus in the synagogue in Nazareth follows on immediately from last week's Gospel, if you remember Jesus speaking in the synagogue on the Sabbath and quoting from the prophet Isaiah, that the Lord's year of favour had arrived and that the words of the prophet were now being fulfilled, we heard of how they are all astonished at the way he speaks and that he wins their approval.

But, as we hear today in this 2nd part of the story, things turn sour quite quickly, the people there seem to find it hard to accept that one of their own could be a great preacher, rabbi or prophet. They say how can Joseph's son, the son of a carpenter be so special! Jesus doesn't seem to be surprised by this, he knows of how most of the prophets of old were rejected by their own people – no prophet is ever accepted in his own country he says.

He also goes on to quote examples from the past when the prophet's teaching was accepted by non-Hebrews, of how not only had the chosen people not listened to the word, but none of the Hebrews had listened and how God's grace and gifts had come to them; he quotes examples from the time of the great prophets Elisha and Elijah, when God healed a pagan leper called Naaman and helped a pagan woman suffering through famine.

This infuriates those listening, he is accusing them of not listening to God's word, being like the disobedient generations of the past, and hinting that God's word might be taken to non-Jews. And so they try to kill him by throwing him off the cliff near to the town, somehow Jesus is kept safe, maybe his apostles protected him or maybe they just wanted him out of the town.

But whatever their intention they reject him and his word, even after hearing his wonderful teaching. There is nothing new though about this, generation after generation often reject God's word.

Pilgrimage To Poland in the Footsteps of Saint John Paul II, 7th-12th October 2019, price £780, includes flights, hotel accommodation and meals, guided tours.

Day one – Monday, 7th October

We check in at *Gatwick Airport for our xx.xx departure to Krakow scheduled to arrive at xx.xx (local time). Having cleared customs we will travel by coach to Zakapone in the Tatra Mountains, stopping en-route for a late lunch. Our accommodation is in the La Salette Pilgrim House where we will celebrate Mass and then have a traditional Polish dinner after which there will be free time for those who want to walk into town.

Day two – Tuesday, 8th October

We begin our day with breakfast before leaving to visit the Shrine of Our Lady of Fatima, built in thanksgiving for the survival of Blessed John Paul after the assassination attempt in May 1981. Here we will celebrate Mass and spend some time in the beautiful grounds before taking the Funicular railway to the top of Mount Gubalowka. We break for lunch and then travel to Krakow where we will have a guided tour of the old city; the cathedral, and the bishop's palace where Cardinal Karol used to live. We continue through the old streets to the market square and finish at the church of St Mary before we drive to our hotel for our evening meal and overnight accommodation.

Day three – Wednesday, 9th October

After breakfast we drive to Auschwitz where there will be a guided tour followed by a visit to the near-by Birkenau extermination camp. We then drive the short distance to Wadowice where we break for lunch. After lunch we visit the family home of John Paul, which is now a museum and then to the Basilica of the Presentation of Our Lady, where the future Pope was baptised. Here we celebrate Mass after which we have the chance to enjoy the famous local puff-pastry cakes which were a favourite of the Pope before we return to our hotel for our evening meal and overnight accommodation.

Day four – Thursday, 10th October

After breakfast the coach will take us to the world famous salt mines at Wieliczka where we will be given a guided tour, ending with Mass in the underground chapel. (Please be aware that there are several steps on this tour and pilgrims should be aware that the walking tour will take up to three hours.) After Mass we come back to the surface where we go to a local restaurant for lunch. After lunch the coach will take us to the centre of Krakow where the afternoon will be free to revisit some of the sites, take stroll through the street or just sit at a pavement café watching the world go by. We make our own way back to the hotel for our evening meal and overnight accommodation.

Day five – Friday, 11th October

After breakfast we travel to Czestochowa, the National Marian shrine in Poland. The town had great significance for Blessed John Paul II who was devoted to the "Black Madonna" which we shall visit. We will have a guided tour of the shrine and lunch at a local restaurant after which there will be some free time to walk the Stations of the Cross or to spend in quiet prayer. We will end the visit with Mass before returning to our hotel for our evening meal and overnight accommodation. Our meal this evening will be in a local restaurant where we will have a traditional Polish meal.

Day six – Saturday, 12th October

After breakfast we leave the hotel and visit the Shrine of Divine Mercy where we can see the relics of Sister Faustina. We then visit the new church and can take the lift to the top of the tower for some spectacular views over the old city. We then cross the river to the Shrine of Blessed John Paul II, a newly built church, where we can visit the relic of the late Pope and it is here that we celebrate our final Mass. We break for lunch before leaving for the *airport at Krakow for our xx.xx flight to the UK due to arrive at xx.xx local time.
